TREE NURSERY

Indigenous forest and shrub species are grown here to be used in reforestation activities intended to offset the carbon footprint produced by visitors.

STAY IN CERDEIRA, EXPLORE THE CENTRE OF PORTUGAL



WHAT TO EXPLORE

The eastern flank of the **Lousã Mountains** is bordered by a steeply sloped valley at the base of which the **River Ceira** flows. **Góis** is the main village that the river meets along its course and the marriage between them is perfect. Before reaching **Góis**, this tour takes you to four **Schist**

Villages that share the Penedos de Góis, a quartzite formation that stands out amid the Lousã massif, as a backdrop. After Góis, head slightly upwards along the Ceira valley to Cabreira, where the river and manmade constructions create a harmonious scene.

SCHIST VILLAGES

There are 27 villages within this network. Four of the smallest are settlements on this side of the mountain, each with a scenic setting.

GÓIS

In 2014, the village of Góis (200m altitude) celebrated the 900-year anniversary of the Letter of Donation in which Countess Teresa and her son Afonso Henriques delivered the lands of Góis to Anaia Vestrares and his wife Ermesinda Martins to administer. King Manuel I granted the village a new charter in 1516.

RIVER CEIRA

From a spring in the highest points of the Açor Mountains the Ceira's course follows the base of an enclosed valley until it eventually merges into the left side of the River Mondego, just outside Coimbra.

MOST IMPORTANT PLACES



PORTUGUESE LAUREL

On the banks of the Pena stream several examples of one of the rarest native trees in Portugal, the Portuguese laurel (scientific name Prunus lusitanica), can be found. It has shiny dark green leaves and exudes a pleasant aroma when in flower.


PENEDA RIVER **BEACH - PEGO ESCURO**

Winner of several awards since 2013 including Blue Flag, Gold Quality and Accessible Beach. The beach stretches along Góis' pleasant urban waterfront and offers various activities and quality services. Go for a dip in the river which begins in the Açor Mountains.

GÓIS PARISH CHURCH

Built in the 15th century, the church underwent several interventions over the following centuries, particularly the façade, which dates from the 19th century. Once inside you will see why it is classified as a National Monument. In addition to the 16th century Manueline chapel by Diogo de Castilho, there is the 16th century tomb of Lord Luís da Silveira and family, embellished with an exquisitely decorated arch evoking the Assumption of Our Lady. It is a Renaissance masterpiece.

CHAPEL OF ST. SEBASTIAN

In front of the entrance to the Royal Bridge, the octagonal 18th century chapel on the left bank features square stone blocks on its corners, an ornate portal and a stone-capped cupola. It houses an 18th century altarpiece and two wooden sculptures from the same period.

CISTERN IN LARGO DO POMBAL

A fountain with a perfect arch, the interior of which is clad with 16th century Hispano-Moresque tiles.

CASTLE CHAPEL

A 16th century Manueline building which features a coat of arms above the doorway pertaining to the lords of the village. The chapel is crowned with battlements and composed of two distinct sections with ribbed vaulted ceilings. The square stones stand out against white walls.


ROYAL BRIDGE

Built in the 16th century during the reign of King Jõao III, the bridge has three semicircular arches. A national emblem. the Cross of Christ and the armillary sphere, adorns the central arch. The 450 years during which it has withstood the foul winter moods of the River Ceira attest to its robustness. It is classified as a Monument of Public Interest.



CABREIRA

Within the natural environment of the right bank of the River Ceira we find a harmonious complex made up of an olive oil press (1876), the structures where olives were stored (lofts), the watermill and the Old Bridge.





climb COMAREIRA - then continue to AIGRA NOVA - _ you will have to return almost as far as Comareira to turn right to reach the crossroad that provides access to AIGRA VELHA - go back to the crossroads and take the dirt road that goes downhill to PENA - - from here the road is tarmacked and passes through Ribeira Cimeira before reaching Espoño – follow the EN2 down to GOIS - enter the village, cross the bridge over the River Ceira and CERDEIRA - Lousā - follow EN342 towards Boavista - on the descent after entering Góis municipality, bear right to Comareira - the first 1 km is a steep follow the road until the fire station - turn right to CABREIRA - return to Góis and then drive to Lousa - CERDEIRA.
